

Sunnybrook Anesthesia Chair in Perioperative Sciences (Limited term)

The Department of Anesthesia at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre and the University of Toronto is seeking an anesthesiologist to fulfill the appointment as the Chair in Perioperative Sciences. The successful candidate must be eligible for an academic appointment at the rank of Associate or Full Professor in the Department of Anesthesia, Faculty of Medicine, at the University of Toronto. The anticipated start date will be November 1, 2018, or one which is mutually agreed upon. The inaugural Chair in Perioperative Sciences will be for an initial five-year term with possible renewal for a subsequent five-year term upon successful review at the end of the first term.

The Chair in Perioperative Sciences is based out of Sunnybrook Health Science Centre. The mandate of the Chair is to conduct high quality research in the perioperative domain. This will support the candidate in securing competitive, peer-reviewed operating funding and high impact publications. Specifically, the candidate will establish and expand a research program whose goal is to investigate and generate knowledge that reduces perioperative morbidity and improves patient outcomes. It is also anticipated that the successful candidate will provide leadership and help to establish a graduate student program, forge national/international collaborations, and provide mentorship to junior investigators.

The successful candidate must already hold a full-time clinical academic appointment as a clinician-investigator in the at the rank of Associate or Full Professor in the Department of Anesthesia at Sunnybrook Health Science Centre. He/she must have a medical degree, postgraduate fellowship training, and Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada certification in anesthesia (or equivalent) and be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. The successful candidate must have proven clinical skills at a high level, evidence of demonstrated excellence in research and/or education and a commitment to teaching students, residents, and fellows. Academic excellence will be assessed by review of the applicants' peer-reviewed publications, research grants, invitations to and presentations at significant conferences and events, awards and accolades at a national and international level.

Compensation for clinical activities will depend on the amount of clinical work performed and will be commensurate with qualifications and experience and within the usual range for an anesthesiologist in the Province of Ontario (\$300,000-500,000 per annum).
