### Cough Etiquette

- Wear a medical mask OR
- Cover cough with into sleeve or arm
- Cough into tissue or other disposable item
- Wash hands with soap and water or hand sanitizer for 20 seconds



### Cell Phones

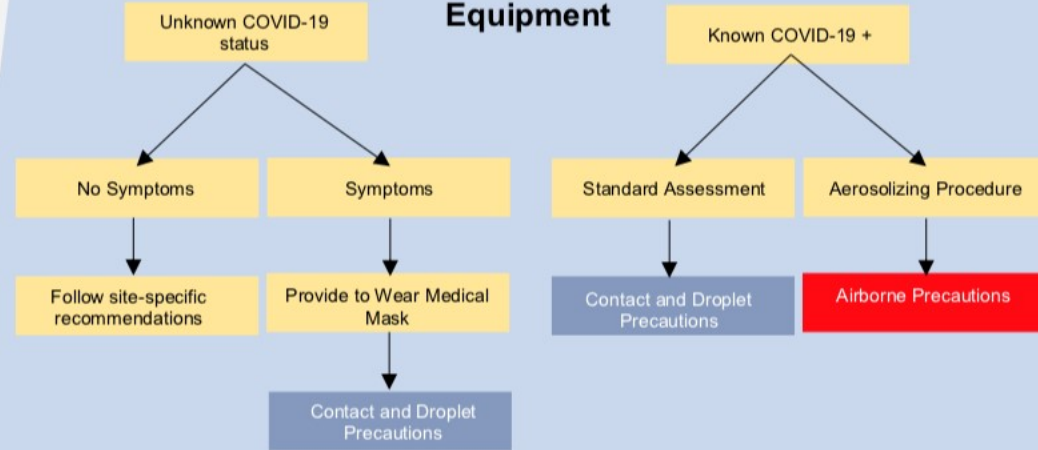
- Can harbor pathogen
- Clean after exposure according to manufacturer
- Avoid cleaning solvents in openings
- Ensure devices are disconnected from power source



### Conserve Resources

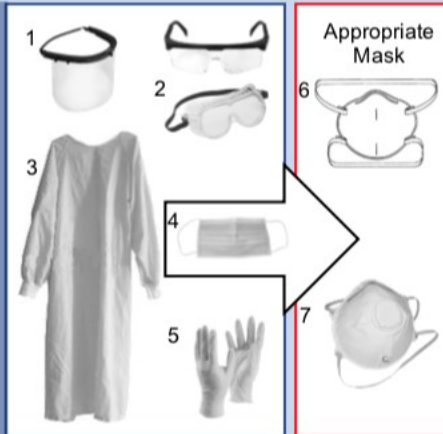
- Minimize patient and family contact
- Use physical barriers where possible (example: glass/plastic windows)
- Minimize patient reassessments, and medication administration where possible for patients in isolation
- Use PPE only when needed

## Personal Protective Equipment



### Standard Precautions

1. Face Shield OR
2. Goggles
3. Waterproof Gown
4. Medical Mask
5. Non-sterile gloves



### Aerosol Precautions

6. N95 respirator OR
7. FFP2 or FFP3
- Double glove

### Events include

- Intubation
- Extubation
- Airway Suctioning
- Non-invasive or Manual ventilation
- Bronchoscopy
- CPR
- Tracheostomy
